draws on aspects of traditional pit-fired Haudenosaunee pottery, which features hand-built coiling and slab construction. Jones' art reflects the issues that have impacted the Haudenosaunee. Doug is a Video and Sound Installation by Bufffluxus, an ensemble composed of musicians, vocalists and artists focused on exploring and developing the ideas and long and short forms proposed by the New Music, Fluxus and Dada art movements. Doug can best be described as an Inter-Media Enjambment (in literature a continuation of a sentence or idea without interruption) On view Nov 10, 2023 - Apr 28, 2024
